SCRIPTURE CARD GUIDE FOR GROUP DISCUSSION

"THE HOUR" MARCH 13 & 14

SERIES OVERVIEW:

When Jesus ascended into heaven after his resurrection, he didn't tell us to just try to make the best of things for awhile. He didn't institute the church so that His followers would have a place to hang out over shared interests until we die and go to be with Him. Before Jesus was crucified for us, He was clear that He would be coming back and that how we live while He's gone will impact how He deals with us when He returns. This life isn't all there is. There's more to come in the next age. As we journey through Lent, we will learn from Him what it means to keep watch and be alert as we wait for His triumphal return.

Follow the directions below for a guided group discussion with a friend, in a family, small group, etc. Grab a Scripture Card (printed or electronic) and simply follow steps from 1 to 6 on this page and the next.

OPENING PRAYER:

About 2 minutes

Ask a volunteer to open in prayer.



We cannot know the precise hour of Jesus' return, but we can be sure that the signs He's already told us to watch for are indicators that the end of the age is near. Rather than obsessing over the precise hour of Jesus' return, we should remember as long as Jesus has not yet come back, He's extending His kindness toward all. Peter says, "He is being patient for your sake. He does not want anyone to be destroyed, but wants everyone to repent." Jesus goes on to explain how we ought to live in the meantime.



INTRO QUESTION:

About 10 minutes

In what situations is it most difficult for you to be patient? When it is easier for you to be patient?



Are you still watching?

Jesus replied, "However, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven or the Son himself. Only the Father knows." - Matthew 24:36 NLT



Read the full passage in your Bible - Matthew 24:32-36.

What sticks out or grabs your attention from the scripture readings?

Are you ready for Jesus to return? How does one get ready or be ready?

God's patience (or delay) is all about his heart that everyone would repent (see **2 Peter 3:9**). How might this impact the way you pray and the way you live each day?



DISCUSSION HELP:

Use follow-up questions to take the discussion deeper. Guide answers to be honest and real.

Can you say more about that?

How have you seen that play out in your life?

What does that stir up in you?

Has anyone else had a similar thought or experience?

What might God be inviting you to do?

SCRIPTURE READING + GROUP DISCUSSION

About 40–45 minutes

Read the entire scripture passage aloud as a group and discuss the questions on the card above. Use the **Discussion Help sidebar** to encourage deeper discussion.

For whom are you praying to come to faith in Jesus? Be specific.





Read this section aloud. Take a moment to go to the website listed. Click on "Pray Today". A country of the day will be shown. Read the information aloud and pray for that country now as a group.

Discuss practical ways to grow in prayer for others who don't yet know Jesus as their Lord and Savior.



CLOSING GROUP PRAYER:

About 10 minutes

Read the prayer section on the card aloud, and take a moment of silence for each person to reflect on the prayer prompt personally.

Close with a popcorn style prayer. Pray for the first name of someone who you would like to come to faith in Jesus. Consider a particular Bible verse you would like to pray in regard to them. The leader or apprentice will open and close the prayer time.
