Remain In Me

John 15:5 "Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing." (NLT)

As we look to Lent and turn toward God, what do you need? What does God want for you? Jesus tells us to remain in Him, connected to the vine, because the vine provides all the nutrients and refreshment needed for the branch. How do we do that?

Where do you find refreshment? A Netflix binge with a bag of Oreos doesn't really do the trick. But other activities can renew and re-create you into the person God made you to be. Maybe it's finding refreshment in God's creation, music or the arts, active outdoor activities, reading and journaling, time in community, reflecting on God's Word, and in prayer. How has God wired your soul for refreshment?

Create some rhythms or patterns in life to regularly soak in God's goodness. Not only for 40 days in Lent, but throughout the year. Put a block of time on your calendar to be refreshed in the Lord yearly, quarterly, weekly, and daily. It might look like a yearly getaway, a quarterly special activity day, a weekly Sabbath day, and a daily few moments away with the Lord. The fruit of God's Kingdom comes from first abiding in Him. So rest, relax, and breathe. Let God refresh you!

COVID Ten Commandments

In January I had the opportunity to be on a Zoom call with Pastor Rick Warren, the founder of Saddleback Church in California. We discussed the impact of 2020 on the church, and he shared his Ten Commandments for surviving COVID. As we enter into the season of Lent under the theme of Rest, Relax, and Breathe; I pray that you find his words refreshing.

- 1. Show grace to myself and to others (James 4:6).
- 2. Start and end each day refueling your soul (James 1:21, Psalm 92:2).
- 3. Set and stick to a simple routine (Ephesians 5:15-16).
- 4. Stop watching so much news; what I see is what I become (Proverbs 15:14).
- 5. Schedule a daily connection with those you love (I Thessalonians 5:11).
- 6. Share your feelings instead of stuffing them (Galatians 6:2, James 5:16).
- 7. Seek advice for big decisions (Proverbs 15:22).
- 8. Space renewal breaks throughout the day (Isaiah 58:11).
- 9. Serve someone else who is suffering more than me (Matthew 25:34-36).
- 10. Control what you can control and trust God for the rest (James 2:22).

As you make your way through the list, I encourage you to spend some time with each of them. Pay attention to see if you sense God opening your heart to any of the commandments where He might be inviting you to grow. I was especially drawn to commandment number 2. Rick shared the acronym HWFWHWLW (*His Word First Word His Word Last Word*) as a way to think about being in the Word. Too often I start my day looking at my phone and end my day doing the same. What if instead I spent a moment or two reading the Word until something grabbed my attention? It might only be a verse or two, but, what better way to start and end the day!

May this season of Lent be a time where you can be refreshed by Jesus as you Rest, Relax, and Breathe.

WLC Brand Ministry Action Team Update

In December the Church Council chartered a Ministry Action Team to explore Woodbury Lutheran's name and brand. Below is information and Q & A's from the work that the team has done todate.

Background

The Woodbury Lutheran Church (WLC) brand has served our church well. As our church continues to explore and pursue multi-site ministry and more strategic outreach, we must consider if our name should become more reflective of our people, culture, and mission rather than a place on the map or a particular denomination.

A unique challenge for Woodbury Lutheran is our community driven name, which works great in Woodbury, but becomes clumsy and not as meaningful in different communities. That being said, Woodbury Lutheran has brand equity due to more than 50 years of great history, so to just scrap it in favor of a whole new brand may not be wise.

We have created a small team made up of church staff, council members, and elders to lead a rebranding exploration to answer three core questions:

- 1. How does having "Woodbury" in our name impact us as we move into multiple communities?
- 2. How does having "Lutheran" in our name impact us in a changing culture?
- 3. Does the name "Woodbury Lutheran" allow us to best fulfill our vision?

Key Questions

Q. Has a decision been made leaving the LCMS? to change our name?

A. No. A decision has not been made, but we are strongly considering other options that may better describe our people, culture and mission.

How will the church **O**. congregation be involved in the process?

A. We plan to actively include people from the congregation in the process. We will be forming a congregational committee steering to provide feedback and input into the process. In addition, we will share insights and name options with the larger congregation as they are established.

Q. Who gets to make the final decision?

A. While multiple voices and inputs will be used in the process, the Church Council will make a recommendation and the congregation will make the final decision by vote.

O. What's the timeline for this effort?

A. The team is planning to have a recommendation for consideration on or before June 1st. If a decision to change the name is made, we would target launching the new brand in Fall 2021.

Q. Would we consider changing our name even if the Concordia merger is not approved?

A. Yes. Our three existing campuses (Valley Creek. Oak Hill, Online) could still potentially benefit from a brand change.

Q. Will we change what we believe? Are we considering

A. Our mission, values, and



beliefs will not be changing nor are we considering leaving the LCMS.

Q. Rebranding will mean extra costs to change names on buildings, websites, etc. Do we have a budget for that?

A. Yes. We have been putting money aside as part of our multi-site fund to pay for expenses like this should we choose a change.

Teaching your kids spiritual habits gives them a foundation of faith that will continue to help them grow as disciples of Jesus. This can be a challenge! We all know how busy our lives get. Even with a pandemic, we manage to fill our calendars and lives with activities.

What if you made space in your family life to have dinner together a couple of times a week? What if during dinner together you read a Bible verse and talked about it together? During Christmastime End Slavery Ministries Ecuador (ESME) hosts Christmas parties for hundreds of women in prostitution. ESME brings a message of hope through Jesus. Listen as ESME worker (and WLC missionary) Hannah Zook shares about the Christmas party hosted in late-December in the city of Quito:

"It's all about relationship ... as I sat across the table from woman after woman in prostitution, listening to their stories, praying together, laughing, crying, sharing photos of my son with them, I was reminded again that relationship HAS to be the basis of everything we do.

When I gave Cristina her Christmas gift she said, 'Thanks, but more than anything you can give me, thanks for your time.'

Nothing is better than genuine connection, friendship with no ulterior motives & time spent just being together. Such a good reminder this Christmas. Aren't we all in need of those that will just sit with us, make time for us & linger in sweet friendship? I know I need that in my life."

This is our traditional preschool program. Children come together to learn important early skills which prepare them for kindergarten. Our small class sizes offer opportunities for individualize learning to ensure each child experiences growth and success.

- Children must be 34 months by September 1st and must be fully potty trained
 - <u>3 Half Days</u> Monday -Wednesday-Friday 9am-12pm \$288 per month
 - <u>3 Full Days</u> Monday -Wednesday-Friday 9am-2pm \$423 per month
 - <u>2 Half Days</u> Tuesday & Thursday 9am-12pm \$220 per month
 - <u>2 Full Days</u> Tuesday & Thursday 9am-2pm \$316 per month

Meeting Highlights

Financially:

2020 income was \$3,441,181 giving a roughly \$156k operating surplus. The surplus will be divided between missions, long term capital improvement, future multisite, and cash flow.

The decision by the Council to pay off another \$500,000 of our mortgage was approved contingent upon WLC receiving confirmation that our \$519,000 PPP loan was forgiven.

The budget for 2021 was approved at \$3,493,000 approx. \$50,000 increase of 2020 actual.

Concordia, South St. Paul:

The WLC Council approved a resolution to recommend that Concordia become a campus of WLC. The resolution will be voted on by the congregation.

WLC Brand and Name:

The team has contacted other churches that have gone through a name change. They have researched potential consulting firms that could help with community surveys to establish the BRAND impact or non-impact of the Woodbury Lutheran Church name.

Council Member Changes for 2021:

Renee Boehme, Troy Wenck, and Larry Hall will have terms ending at the January 2021 Annual congregational Meeting. Sheryl Breiholz, Todd Watanbe, and Wade Amundson will be beginning their terms on Council pending congregational approval.
