#### **Building Updates**

Over the past few weeks, and throughout the summer a variety of updates will be taking place in the building. 
#### **Campus Pastor Search**

## **Come, Follow Me**

"One day as Jesus was walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers–Simon, also called Peter, and Andrew–throwing a net into the water, for they fished for a living. Jesus called out to them, "Come, follow me..." Matthew 4:18-19

In a matter of two verses, the first two of the people that would walk and live and work with Jesus were interrupted, and invited. The invitation was simple. The invitation was clear. And yet, somehow, the invitation was pretty vague at the very same time.

Perhaps they wondered - "Follow? Where are we going?" "Who are you anyway?" And, "Who do you think you are to call us away from our living, friends, and family?" "Well... You're pretty confident! Who are you, that you would even think we'd consider it?" While those questions would remain unanswered in that moment, the scriptures tell us, in two different places - by two different people, that they would stop what they were doing and do what he had invited them to do.

Those questions would be answered in due time along the way. While they were on their way, they would come to know him, trust him, and even more. What if the same were true for us? What if Jesus has, in fact, come along, and interrupted your life? Have you stopped to consider that he has invited you to follow him... and to do so with all the questions and with all the uncertainty that you may have... to just follow... him? Have you thought of it in that way? Think about how simple and easy and encompassing that invitation is from his perspective. He knows who you are. He knows who you care about. He sees what you worry about. He knows what you're good at. He knows where you may be a little rough around the edges. He knows who he is. He is clear on why he is here. He is well aware of what he is capable of. He knows what he wants us to do. Notice that there are no caveats or conditions. He's pretty direct as well.

The "re-opening" from COVID and the lifting of restrictions related to the pandemic shines light and brings a dawn to the promise of a new day. The launch of another campus and the opportunity to bring others into community... into OUR community - in such a time as this is when people have been craving to be together again - is all in God's timing.

This next season of ministry at Woodbury Lutheran is going to bring many opportunities. Opportunities to dig in, to trust, to learn, to follow, and to dig in as we learn to trust while we follow.

Look for your opportunity. Prepare now to hear his call. Prepare now to take your next step, to follow as he leads and to go as you are invited.

## **Spoken For**

For most of the summers during my undergraduate career, I worked for a mission trip organization and spent two summers running mission trips in Cortez, Colorado, Cortez is a small town in the Southwest corner of Colorado in the middle of the desert and between the Navajo reservation and the Ute reservation. A few weeks into my first summer there, our boss told my team that four of us were placed in Cortez for a very specific reason: to build relationships. The organization I worked for was very intentional about the communities that they had mission trips site in. They weren't in the business of going in for a week and leaving. They believed in long standing relationships in the community. We were told that we were placed there specifically to solidify both the relationships between our organization and the churches in the area and begin to make connections with the Navajo and Ute people. I spent my two summers getting to know the community members. I spent time with pastors, joking with them and talking theology with them. I learned how to greet Navajo tribal leaders in their native tongue in order to show my respect for their people and their culture. I unlearned the Western idea of a firm handshake while introducing myself to Native Americans to communicate that I was equal with them.

A couple of weeks ago, I was at our South St. Paul campus taking pictures. I walked into the fellowship hall and saw items laying out on tables for members of Concordia to claim and take home with them. I saw pictures and paintings, books, table cloths, etc. Next to the items that were claimed were pieces of paper that said, "spoken for". As I looked around the room, I thought about the history of these items. Of the people who came to know Jesus better through the ministries of Concordia in South St. Paul. Of the disciples that were made and of the lives transformed.

We at Woodbury Lutheran are beginning a new adventure. We're stepping into a new community. We are bridging relationships between the people of Concordia and the people of Woodbury Lutheran. We're learning history, we're hearing stories. We're showing that we're in the business of stepping into communities and being in it for the long haul. The merging of two churches isn't always easy. Traditions will probably change, things won't be done the same way they've always been done. But isn't that the way it always goes? From the beginning of the church at Pentecost to Martin Luther and the time of the Reformation, change has always been a part of the story. But at the core of this change is community; of realizing that following Jesus isn't meant to be done on our own but instead in fellowship with others. We're committing to multiply disciples and transform lives together.

And I can't think of a greater adventure than that.

## **Meeting Highlights**

May is the annual strategic planning meeting for the Church Council. We met for almost four hours to pray, see how we are doing and discuss the future of WLC. As you can imagine in four hours lots of words are used, below are a few highlights.

**Strategic Plan:** In 2019 a team of lay leaders worked with the staff team to develop a five year ministry plan focused on Discipleship Impact, Reach and Multisite, the plan can be found <u>Here</u>. The Council spent a significant amount of time talking through each focus area of the plan and believes that with some small tweaks it will keep us moving in the right direction.

**Metrics:** For many years the "success" of a church was measured by attendance and financial metrics. Over the last several years we have begun to measure things like baptisms, servants and those participating in Small Groups. <u>Here</u> you can find a working dashboard of what we measure at WLC. Each measurement is weighted and will be put into a formula that helps to better measure our churches health.

**Key Actions/Tactics:** Within the strategic plan there are specific goals that the staff builds strategies around. The Council continues to believe in the importance of Small Groups, Online Ministry and connecting with new people in our communities. We also believe that this fall is the perfect time to launch a spiritual campaign focused on reconnecting our congregation to the Discipleship Path and continuing to put ourselves in a strong financial position for the future.

WLC Brand and Name: The team continues to gather feedback internally and are waiting on external data. The team is not in a hurry and appreciates all the feedback we have been getting.

**Concordia, South St. Paul:** So far we have over 100 current WLC members who are committed to going to the new campus. Our Search Team has interviewed three candidates for the Campus Pastor role and we are working hard at developing metrics and ministry plans for the summer and into the fall.
