

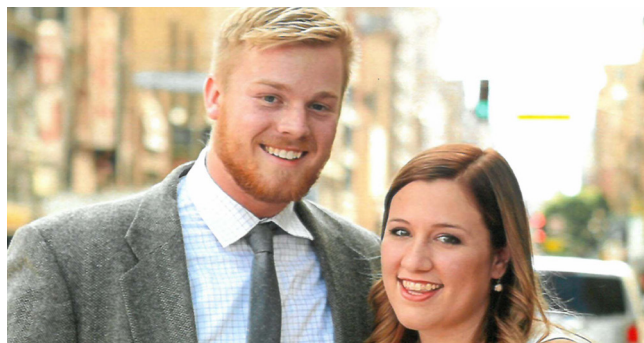

Welcoming Our New Vicar in August

My name is **Quincy Koll** and I grew up in Lincoln, Nebraska. My parents raised me in the Lutheran Church and my mother was the secretary for the senior pastor at my home congregation for most of my formative years. I was involved in a variety of ministries at my church in the Lincoln community. I taught 4th grade Sunday school and middle school confirmation classes while also participating in small group Bible study. I took a mission trip to Haiti when I was 15 and began my interest in cross cultural work. I also worked with a skateboarding ministry through the non-profit organization "Back to the Bible." During my high school years, I was a member of the swim team, year book, and I participated in an IT focus program to learn graphic design skills.

Upon graduation, I attended Concordia University Irvine to begin my pre-seminary studies. There I was accepted into an academically intense, service-learning opportunity called the Around-the-World Semester. Before departing, I spent a summer in Curitiba, Brazil living with a missionary family and then continued on the traveling semester taking 15 academic units in history, literature, cultural relations, and service learning while visiting 10 different countries. After nine months abroad, I returned to Concordia in Irvine and resumed a variety of roles. I was the marketing coordinator for Student Leadership, producing a number of posters and t-shirts, as well as the theme for the 2015-16 academic year. I also worked with the Admissions department in a number of capacities ranging from tour-guide, road warrior/recruiter, and assistant events coordinator. I helped plan and execute the 2016 National Youth Gathering booth and a number of on campus visitation events exceeding 700 attendees. Other internships I participated in included a summer at Christ Lutheran Church in Phoenix, AZ and a year of practicum work with St. Johns Lutheran Church of Orange, CA.

I met my wife, Courtney, during my Sophomore year at Concordia. Courtney, my roommate Steve, and I had been invited by our mutual friend Jessica to stay with her family in Phoenix for the Easter holiday. After the trip, Courtney and I began dating and were engaged before my senior year. Courtney graduated before me, but stayed in Irvine for an extra year to complete a Master's degree in Business Administration. We were married on June 30, 2017 in Burbank CA. It was special to both of us because her grandfather, Rev. Robert Hentz, officiated the service just as he had done for her parents in the same church that he once served as Senior Pastor.

We began our journey to seminary in mid-July and quickly became involved in campus life. Courtney became a member of the Seminary Women's Association and I began working for the seminary grounds and maintenance department. A few months later, Courtney was employed by the Creative Services department as a graphic designer producing a number of seminary publications. We have enjoyed our time here [at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO] and the community of people preparing for ministry, but we are very excited to begin our vicarage year and focus on the practical application of ministry. We are looking forward to our time at Woodbury Lutheran Church this coming August.

One of my favorite topics to talk about is the importance of learning to be generous. The reason that I love to talk about is not because I think God needs more of your money, it is because I have seen my own life and the life of my family be transformed as we continue to learn the power of clinging less to “stuff” and more to Jesus.

In the Gospels Jesus talks a lot about the importance of having a healthy relationship with our finances, because He knew how tempted we would be to find our value, hope and safety in our “stuff.” Instead, Jesus says let me offer you a better way, one where we are invited to seek after Him first, and He promises to take care of the rest.

At WLC we talk about being on a Generosity Journey, a journey where we are all learning to follow Jesus and grow in our trust of Him. The great thing about this journey is that although we are all in different places, we are all on the journey together.

In June we are launching a new online giving platform that makes it really easy and secure to give your gifts through text to give or online through our website. This is a great way to move into the intentional step in your giving by setting up a recurring gift. This helps the church have a steady stream of gifts through the year and it helps the giver become intentional in their giving.

What might your next step be in your giving? I believe as our generosity grows (and that doesn't mean just giving at church), we step into a fuller life where we begin to experience the very words of Jesus that it truly is better to give than to receive.

From Kake to Woodbury!

You're Invited: We don't often get the opportunity to meet and hear from a missionary who is on the "front lines" in a cross-cultural setting. **Pastor Joey Chang and his family from Kake, Alaska** will be introduced at all worship services on the two weekends of June 9 & 16. Plus, you're invited to hear Joey share about his ministry with all members at the following event:

- Date: Monday, June 10
- Time: 6:00 – 7:00 pm (light meal served; come for any or all of this time)
- Place: Valley Creek Campus – Fireside Room

He'll also speak briefly at our Oak Hill Campus on Sunday, June 9, at 11:35 am, and at Valley Creek on Sunday, June 16, at 12:05 pm (snacks served at each). We'd love to have all of our members come hear him and meet his family. This month WLC began providing financial support to Pastor Joey, and we'd love all our members to know about him. Why?

It started here: Our church has a 7-year history with Joey's family and ministry, because we've sent short-term teams to the mission site where he serves (more than 110 WLC members!) Kake is an isolated town of about 500 residents, most of whom are Native American, on an island off the west coast of Canada. Pastor Joey arrived there in 2012 to lead a small congregation. But, that church couldn't pay him a salary, so he's been a full-time maintenance worker (for pay, to sustain his family) while carrying out the important ministry of loving, caring for, and presenting Jesus to the folks in Kake. (I think very few of us would take on 2 full-time jobs for 7 years.)

His transition: So why does he need our support? Over the course of the last 2 years Joey discerned the effectiveness of his ministry will be stronger by focusing solely on proclaiming the Gospel, without working a secular job. As of June 1 he is a full-time missionary, and has partnered with The Antioch Partners, a mission agency focused on global church-planting. So Pastor Joey must raise all of his financial support from donors like you and me, and churches like WLC. Our church determined his gospel-based ministry fits well with WLC's vision: Multiplying Disciples | Transforming Lives, and we're excited to provide him financial and other support. The JOSHUA Adventure

See and Discover Who God Made You to Be

DATE RANGE :: 06.02.19 - .07.14.19

Series Synopsis

After deliverance from Egypt, after wandering for years in the wilderness, the book of Joshua is the next step for the people of Israel. God has led them up to the Promised Land. But the people do not just receive it. God calls them and commands them. He raises up Joshua to lead them and guide them. Through the book, we see a definition of leadership different than what often comes to mind. Like the Israelites and like Joshua, we are invited to see and discover who God has made us to be. Then, we are challenged to live and lead for God.

Week # 1 | June 1/2

- **Title ::** You are a Leader
- **Readings**
 - Primary Reading :: Joshua 1:1-11, 16-18
 - Key Verse :: Joshua 1:9
 - Secondary Reading :: 1 Corinthians 9:19-23, 10:31-11:1

Sermon Concept

"The time has come"! The Israelites have been brought out of Egypt, and have spent their time wandering through the wilderness. God has lead them the whole time. But now He is giving them the land He promised. He charges and encourages Joshua. God reminds him that He will be with Joshua always. He invites and challenges Joshua into this role as leader. We are offered the same invitation and challenge. But being a leader doesn't always mean what we expect.

Living It Out

- We are all *invited* to trust God and *challenged* to lead. What might the next step look like for you this week? Make a plan and then step out in faith. See what God does!

Week # 2 | June 8/9

- Title :: You are a Servant
- Readings
 - Primary Reading :: Joshua 2:1-16
 - Key Verse :: Joshua 2:12
 - Secondary Reading :: Proverbs 11:17-21

Sermon Concept

Instead of allowing an enemy to be captured, Rahab saves the lives of the Israelite spies. She knows that their Lord is God. Her servant heart comes at great risk to herself. The spies respond by sparing her life and serving her entire family. We are challenged to serve those around us in the same manner. We benefit God's Kingdom the most by impacting the lives of others. But that isn't the only role of a leader. Indeed, serving others gives us a better picture of who we are ourselves.

- Each Person - Come as you are

Living It Out

- Jesus did not come to be served, but to serve. A disciple is someone who is becoming more like Jesus. What is that one step you could take this week to serve others or to lead with the attitude of a servant?

Week # 3 | June 15/16

- Title :: You are a Teacher
- Readings
 - Primary Reading :: Joshua 3:6-17, 4:4-7
 - Key Verse :: Joshua 4:6-7
 - Secondary Reading :: Luke 10:1-10, 16-18

Sermon Concept

Israel is finally crossing the Jordan River into the Promised Land. God goes before them again and performs a miracle to bring them into the land. God challenges the people to set up a memorial of all that He has done. God challenges them to teach their children, to pass His commands and His miraculous deeds to the future generations. We have the same task — with our children, nieces, nephews, friends, even those older than us — with everyone who doesn't know of what God has done for us.

Living It Out

- God is at work all around us and He invites people like us to be part of his work in people. What step is God leading you to take this week in sharing your story with someone?

Week # 4 | June 22/23

- Title :: You are an Instrument of God
- Readings
 - Primary Reading :: Joshua 5:13-6:1-5, 12-16, 20, 23
 - Key Verse :: Joshua 6:2
 - Secondary Reading :: Matthew 5:13-16

Sermon Concept

God declared that He gave Jericho into the hands of the Israelites. Yet, He gives Joshua specific instructions for His people to follow to capture it. He is not on their side, but they are on His. Following God's instructions brings victory, but not always immediately, and not in the ways we expect. But He calls us for our own specific purpose in His Army, in His Church, in this world.

- Identify someone in your circle of influence that needs encouragement. What can you affirm in them? Do it.

Week # 5 | June 29/30

- Title :: You are Broken
- Readings
 - Primary Reading :: Joshua 6:18-19, 7:1-13
 - Key Verse :: Joshua 7:11
 - Secondary Reading :: Luke 15:1-10

Sermon Concept

After all they've seen, after all that God has done for them, the Israelites still cannot follow His commands. Even Joshua, praised leader of God's People, falls short and listens to men rather than God. God continues to use His broken and sinful people for good. He doesn't give up on them. Even when we fall short, God continues to care for us. He doesn't demand we pay with our lives because Jesus gave His up in our place. God still uses broken people for His Kingdom.

Living It Out

- Reflect on Jesus's death and resurrection that restored our relationship with God. Who do you need to ask to forgive you? Who do you need to forgive? What step can you take this week in restoring these relationships?

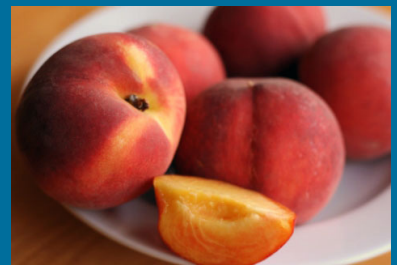
