Here are just a few of the ways we've seen the Holy Spirit move this year.

 Our Wednesday night programs, Roots and Foundations, have met weekly at our Oak Hill and Valley Creek campuses as well as online. These ministries have provided students with biblical teaching, fellowship, and the community of caring small groups. Several students have shared that the support and consistency of these groups was essential to them making it through the challenges of the last year.

- The season of Lent brought the opportunity for students to gather in new and different ways. In addition to continued small group connections, the VC students were able to collectively livestream mid-week worship services, and OH students participated in the fun-filled "Lentlympics"!
- Several students confirmed their faith this past fall and spring and many more have stepped into the process of working toward their own confirmation.

- One of the sweetest moments of all came just a few weeks ago, when Oak Hill students were able to celebrate the baptism of one of their high school students!

Summer Bible study, fellowship events, and mission trips will certainly look different, but we know that God will be present and working through all of it. We eagerly look forward to creating these environments for our young people to grow in their faith, and are so appreciative of WLC's support of its student ministries.

Did you know that the WLC Endowment Fund distributed over \$6,750 last year to serve others and share the Gospel!

\$5,667 was provided to Settled via the Endowment's General Fund. Settled is a local organization that activates and equips faith communities to pursue home with the homeless through sustainable housing, purposeful work, and supportive community. Not only did WLC provide financial resources to Settled, the Serve component of WLC was active in that volunteers from WLC went to the local construction site to work on the construction of the tiny homes for the homeless of our community. \$1,100 was provided to the Zooks who live in Ecuador via the Marlin and Judith VanOverbeke Missions Endowment Fund. This fund was created in May 2020 by the VanOverbeke family with its purpose being reaching people for Jesus by supporting missionaries affiliated with WLC. The Zooks were so appreciative of this gift and the continued prayers for their ministry in the Lord.

As Pastor Tom has mentioned multiple times that the generosity of WLC is awesome and inspiring. This generosity is also shown in the Endowment Fund as over \$163,000 of new contributions was given to the Endowment Fund in 2020, which doubled the Endowment's funds in just one year.

When was the last time you got the oil changed in your car? Generally speaking, the oil change responsibility falls on the husband/head of the household...But what if you are a single mom or widow who isn't sure who to trust with an oil change? Running your car on old oil can be damaging to your car's engine for a variety of reasons, leading to costly repairs if not addressed. To help out, a group of gentlemen from Woodbury Lutheran has decided to offer free oil changes to single moms and widows. This started when I was approached by those who were looking for a method to serve God's people in a new way that would be practical as well. Several Zoom meetings later, we are ready to serve!

To get your oil changed properly, this new ministry of Woodbury Lutheran will take your vehicle to an offsite location nearby that is equipped with a grease pit. While waiting for your car's oil to be changed, you can spend time in the Genesis room, or if you want to enjoy the weather, you can wait outside. If you have children and the weather is nice, the playground will also be available. The entire process should be close to 30 minutes.

By filling out the above form, it will enable us to buy the specific parts needed for your vehicle. Once your form is submitted, we will be in touch with you the week before to remind you of your upcoming appointment. All you need to do is bring your vehicle to the east parking lot of Woodbury Lutheran at the designated time that you sign up for and a short while later you will have fresh oil and a new filter for your car.

One more thing that will be available, if you desire, is some basic education on checking your oil, tire pressure, fluid levels, etc. You don't need to do this, but if you would like additional training, we will be happy to provide that to you as well.

Meeting Highlights

Financially:

Our first quarter income is slightly ahead of budget. We will be spending a significant amount of our Multisite and Long Term Capital dedicated funds on the new South St. Paul Campus and a new LED Wall in the Valley Creek Sanctuary (the projector died).

Park and Ride at Valley Creek:

We were approached by a realtor who is interested in buying the Park and Ride lot. We had a similar offer two years ago and the Council continues to feel like we should not sell that asset.

Fall Spiritual Campaign:

We are in the very early process of developing a fall campaign that will focus on our Discipleship Path and preparing us for future ministry opportunities.

WLC Brand and Name:

The team continues to gather feedback internally and are waiting on external data. The team is not in a hurry and appreciates all of the feedback we have been getting.

Concordia, South St. Paul:

So far we have almost 80 current WLC members who are committed to going to the new campus. Our Search Team has interviewed three candidates for the Campus Pastor role and we are working hard at developing metrics and ministry plans for the summer and into the fall.
