My mom was a guilter. She had a keen eye for fabrics and how they could play a role in creating a beautiful work of art. There could be a drab brown, a seemingly boring black or a bold red that appeared to clash with everything around it and yet it flowed throughout the other colors to play its role in creating something beautiful.



Painting a Picture

"You stand alone in splendor, YOU REIGN IN MAJESTY, Your hands formed all creation, and your hands are holding me," ("You Hold It All" by Travis Ryan). What an amazing juxtaposition of power. The same Jesus reigning in majesty holds me?

We all have our favorite words that paint a picture of our relationship with Jesus: friend, brother, confidante, healer... I'd like you to spend some time ruminating on what the consequences are if Jesus is your King. What incites laud, praise and glory more than kingship?

Kingship forces recognition. It invites reverence, humility, awe, trust and allegiance. In our lifetime, we have seen kings ascend and fall from power. Stories chronicling these are at our fingertips. In hindsight we can easily see the qualities of kings that brought about both, but now you are invited to pause, and come with a readiness to consider a king who is both present, right here, right now, and eternal, a king whose qualities embody perfect love and whose justice includes forgiveness. This is a king who revealed himself in his full glory on a mountain to his closest friends and ultimately showed himself a servant at the deepest and most selfless level.


I ran into this as I was reading yesterday. Ernest Hemingway, in speaking of his beliefs regarding writing said, "All you have to do is write the truest sentence that you know." I wondered if it would be a discipline to adopt during lent to write, every day, "Jesus is my king, and the King loves me." It is one of the truest sentences I know.

Throughout the weeks leading up to Easter, our church family will be recognizing and celebrating the kingship of Jesus. You will see this across campuses visually, in music and in the words our pastors will share. Below is listed just a few of the songs you will be hearing and singing in worship leading up to Easter. I encourage you to look them up and make them part of your lent canon of music. Consider also what your truest sentence regarding King Jesus might be, write it down today and bring a readiness to celebrate and honor the King this month.

You may have an idea of what a small group is, and may even be part of one, but have you ever thought about why? Why do I attend this group? How does this help me and others grow as Jesus followers?

This is a good conversation for every small group to have together. What are we covenanting or agreeing to do together? Understanding your purpose and knowing what you are trying to accomplish is essential. Otherwise, you may find your group wandering in the desert like the Israelites: complaining, setting up false gods, and wondering how long you have to keep doing this!

As followers we are discovering our identity in Jesus, becoming more like Him, and helping others do the same. How would these three help define your personal why and your corporate why as a group? Consider setting aside a small group gathering to discuss the questions below:

- What does finding my identity in Jesus mean to me and what additional questions do I have about that? What could we learn about each other's stories or what could we study to continue to grow deeper in this area?
- How does our small group help us to become more like Jesus? What practices are we doing today that we want to continue? What practices could we start doing that would grow us in this area? In what ways does being in community help us to become more like Jesus that we couldn't do alone?

How do we help others discover their identity in Jesus and become more like him? It's not all about me, but about passing along what Jesus has done and is doing to others. Who can I pour into? How we connect with others and invite them to group? Do we set aside intentional time to apprentice others?

Have someone in the group take notes and distribute to everyone. Use the notes to guide the next steps for your group.

Of course there are some standards you should include in your group covenant or agreement. Like making the group a priority in your schedule. Confidentiality: that nothing of a personal nature that is shared in this group will be shared with anyone outside this group. And authenticity, that we will be real and honest in our sharing with each other and to listen well, seeking first to understand, then to be understood.

A group covenant brings clarity to what you are doing and why. Jesus knew His identity as the King over all things and His purpose in dying on the cross. As your small group builds relationships, and gathers together, be clear on your group's identity and purpose to grow as followers of Jesus.

"Jesus the King" Family Devotions for You!

Each year, the Christian church starts a forty-day journey leading to Easter (Sundays are excluded), known as the season of Lent. This year the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and concludes on Easter Sunday (April 17).

What is Ash Wednesday? Ash Wednesday is a day of repentance when Christians confess their sins and profess their devotion to God. During the worship service, ashes are placed on a worshipper's forehead in the shape of a cross.

What is Lent? Lent serves as a season to meditate on the suffering that Christ endured on our behalf, to repent of our sins and, to reflect upon what it means to live as a child of God. There is a worship service every Wednesday during Lent at 7 pm.

WLC Kids Ministry is providing a special family devotion called "Jesus the King" so that you can learn together with your kids during this Lent season. This is a one day per week devotion which takes only 10 minutes to do! Choose a consistent day and time that works for your family (i.e., Sunday at dinner time, or as a wind down before bed) and work through the devotion as a family-get everyone involved!

- Read-Use any Bible or the My FIRST HANDS-ON Bible. (This is the Bible that your child may have received from WLC as a 3 year old.)
- Create-Use Legos or Duplo's to make either a two- or three-dimensional shape as listed in the devotion. If you don't have Legos, use playdough, or draw the items on paper. Snap a picture and share your creation on the WLC Kids Facebook page.

- Talk About-While hands are busy creating, spark discussion with the Talk About questions.
- Pray-End your time together with the simple prayer provided.

The benefits of learning together as a family are many! Your kids see you reading the Bible and praying with them. They see that this is important to you and that you want to share this special time with them. This time together also teaches your kids that learning about Jesus doesn't just happen at church, but can happen at home or anywhere!

Paper copies will be available at your campus and your Kids Ministry staff will also be emailing copies to your family. We hope that you take advantage of this great opportunity to study God's Word together as a family!

Starting Point (SP) is a 5-week opportunity (class) to explore faith. It's a conversational environment where you'll experience real community.


Who's it for?

Meeting Highlights

January Financials:

Our January financials came in very strong, in fact it was our best January in our history in terms of income. The main reason is that more people are giving once a year due to retirement income requirements and we received some gifts toward Follow. It will allow us to get the ball rolling on some of our Follow initiatives asap.

WLC Policy Manual:

We spent time reviewing our Policy Manual and made a few practical changes around spending unbudgeted money and other grammatical corrections.

WLC and the LCMS:

We continued our discussion around the direction of our denomination and the lack of church workers that are being provided. As we continue to live out our vision this lack of workers will have a large impact on our ability to start new campuses etc.

Next Month the Council will have a conversation around our practice of in-home communion. The Synod has asked churches to stop the practice until there can be more discussion around the practice.

We also sent two resolutions to the District Convention around supporting the ministry of Camp Omega and the SAGES ministry.
