Worship Together on the Afton Land



We spent the summer studying the book of Psalms during Youth Summer Bible study and so many passages have caught my heart...

WLC's Endowment Fund exists to assist members and friends of WLC to make gifts and bequests that will continue serving the donor's selected ministries long after the gift is made. The Fund's purpose is to:

- a. receive gifts of money, stock, real estate or other assets from members and friends of WLC,
- b. pool and invest these assets in order to produce income and/or appreciation,

Tuesday, August 11, 2020

Meeting Highlights:

Worship:

We talked through the survey results from those who attended in-person services. We are continuing to learn and improve both our on-line and in-person offerings. Look for a mix of worship offerings into the fall, including indoor services (unless stuff changes). The Council is very supportive of the direction of staff.

Financially:

We continue to run in the black with income being greater than expenses by almost 50k. The staff has done a great job of managing expenses.

Liberty Ridge:

On July 27th Liberty Ridge stakeholders participated in a virtual town hall meeting. We discussed several long-term options for the Liberty Ridge community including waiting to re-launch, joining in a church merger (like our Oak Hill Campus) or closing altogether.

Preschool:

Like all schools things are very fluid, we have had several staff resign for various personal reasons and we have added Kindergarten as an offering once again. The plan is to do in-person school at this point.
